Together, with your help, we hope to leave a greener, stronger, and even more beautiful neighborhood for generations to come.

We lose about 10 billion trees annually, as 15 billion trees are cut down each year, and only 5 million trees are planted. If these current trends continue at a consistent rate, we could lose all of our trees in the next 300 years.

Our Project

Together, our committee replaced two dead stumps with new trees on Clarissa Ave. These stumps contributed to the heat island effect; an environmental consequence caused by the absence of vegetation that contributes to less shade and increased temperature. By collaborating with LFIA, and the help of local neighbors, our committee was able to provide our neighborhood with new trees. This is a project we hope will blossom into something much larger as we raise awareness towards the unrealized importance of trees.
